- 3. How do Luke 24:13-27, Ephesians 6:12, and 2 Corinthians 5:7 highlight the relationship between faith and empirical evidence in understanding spiritual matters?

- 4. What parallels can you draw between the disciples on the road to Emmaus and people's struggles with faith in contemporary society?
- 5. Discuss the significance of Jesus chastising the disciples for their lack of belief despite having witnessed significant events firsthand. Use Luke 24:22-27
- 6. How does the episode on the road to Emmaus illustrate the importance of faith in recognizing Jesus? Use 1 Corinthians 2:14 in this discussion.
- 7. Discuss the significance of the facts presented in Romans 10:9-13.

Invite the Truth into Your Life

- 8. In what ways does the transfiguration account in Mark 9:2-10 and the Christ hymn of Philippians 2:6-11 alter how we recognize Jesus after his resurrection?
- 9. Reflect on the transformation the disciples undergo from confusion to recognition upon hearing the scriptures and then inviting Jesus to stay with them. What does this signify for believers?
