Confess, Mourn, and Repent

- 4. Reflecting on David's plea to "create in me a clean heart," (Psalm 51:10) discuss what it means to cultivate a heart that aligns with God's will?
- 5. Discuss how David became an example of Isaiah 5:20 and how his prayer in Psalm 51 acknowledges that he needs God to help him out of this state.
- 6. David's prayer includes a desire to be restored to the joy of God's salvation. How does genuine repentance lead to restored joy in our relationship with God?

Strive for Faithfulness not a Quick Fix

- 7. Why did David emphasize the importance of a broken and contrite heart in Psalm 51:17? How does a broken and contrite heart keep us from looking for a quick fix and lead us to fulfill 1 John 1:8-9?
- Discuss why David focuses on the fruit of a righteous life as evidence of true repentance in Psalm 51:13-19.
- 9. What practical steps can individuals take to cultivate a heart of repentance and humility in their daily lives?
